## Tournament raises money for Marlborough scholarship fund

LAKEVILLE - LeBaron Hills Country Club recently hosted the Hillside School of Marlborough's 12th Annual Golf Tournament. The proceeds benefit the school's scholarship aid program. It was the third consecutive year that LeBaron Hills Country Club has hosted the charity golf tournament and subsequent cocktail party and banquet.

Golfers teed off at eleven o'clock with a shotgun start on the 18-hole course. Following the conclusion of tournament play, cocktails were served outside on Sunset Terrace, LeBaron Hills' newest fine dining establishment, and was followed by a buffet dinner featuring Caesar salad, roast beef, Zinfandel marinated chicken and an ice cream sundae bar.

Ninety-four golfers came out in support of the event and made up the 27 teams that competed. They bid on

items in a silent auction that included a 20-inch Samsung flat screen television, a weekend at a Cape home, and a package which included four box seats to a Lowell Spinners game and a VIP luncheon. Participants also received a tournament gift, box lunch and a chance to win an assortment of golf equipment and apparel.

"Our scholarship program benefits tremendously at LeBaron Hills," said Hillside School Headmaster David Z. Beecher. "What makes it so special is that folks from all of our constituencies join together, including alumni, parents and grandparents of current and former students, board members ... everyone from the Hillside family."

"It's a great day to be out here," said Josh Gross, trustee, Platinum Sponsor of the tournament and Hillside alumni from the class of 1984.

"We're at a wonderful place supporting the school and one another."

Founded in 1901, the Hillside School is a private boarding school for boys in grades five through nine. It provides a supportive and challenging environment for traditional learners and those with learning differences. The annual golf tournament is the last major event of the fiscal school year, and the funds raised provide a significant portion of the financial aid awards.
