CAMBRIDGE – **Bluefin Robotics** has hired Newton-based construction manager Commodore Builders to oversee construction of the company's new headquarters in Quincy.

Bluefin plans to relocate to the waterfront property from sites in Cambridge and East Boston in the fall. At least 80 employees are expected to make the move. Renovations have already started on the 54,000-square-foot facility at the site, which is in a section of the former Quincy Shipyard that's owned by Jay Cashman Inc.

Bluefin is renovating the space so it can be used for developing, making and testing its robotic underwater vehicles. Bluefin said 24 subcontractors are union shops, representing about three-quarters of the work. Jacob's Engineering Group of Pasadena, Calif., is the project's architectural and engineering firm.
